

Father-Con 2024 postponed!!




"The future is something which everyone reaches at the rate of sixty minutes an hour, whatever he does, whoever he is." - C.S. Lewis Recently I and some of the board members of Father-Con went to see an Irish film, Nowhere Special, about a single father who has several months to live and is seeking a family to adopt his 4 year old son. The dad is taking Michael to meet prospective adoptive parents without telling his son about his illness or about why there are meeting the families. There is an assumption that the little boy is oblivious to the "adult" conversation occuring in his presence. When he asks his father, "What is adopt?" The dad explains and then his son responds saying, "I don't want to adopt." It was a simple exchange but a reminder that out children understand more than we think, they are aware of more than we want them to be. Later the father creates a box of messages to his son at milestones in his life, like when he passes his drivers test, and other momentos to communicate that his father loved him. By the end of the film our entire row was sniffling and unobtusively wiping away tears. How would you consolidate your message to a child you are not going to see again? As fathers, how often do we think about the lessons our children need to learn in order to open the doors of their future wide and welcoming? How often do we consider that our children are learning more from our actions than our words, and forming their beliefs about life and love from those actions? This film gave each of us a pause to put ourselves into the shoes of a father having to make his exit of this mortal coil with intention and deliberation. We are each casting a pebble in the still waters of a lake and creating ripples that can settle on the shore gracefully, if we see each day as an opportunity calling. Buddha was once asked, what is the biggest mistake we make in life, to which he replied, "The biggest mistake is to think you have time."

Upcoming Events of Father-Con




For the third year, Father-Con will be presenting at the United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime, this year by video with a message about fathers and healthy families on May 15th.
